



MARTINEZ, MARK A., is Professor and Chair of Political Science at California State University, Bakersfield (CSUB). He earned his B.A. in political science (economics minor) from California State University, Chico, and his M.A. and Ph.D. in political science from the University of California, Santa Barbara (1998). Professor Martinez’s book, *The Myth of the Free Market: The Role of the State in a Capitalist Economy* (Kumarian Press, 2009), reviews state-market relations, and won praise from a wide range of economists and public policy experts alike for its review of how markets work and the forces behind the

2008 market meltdown. Professor Martinez has published peer-reviewed articles and book chapters on Mexico and economic development, served as a professional reviewer for academic journals and professional editing houses, and has presented his research and other projects at professional conferences across the United States, Mexico, Europe, and Asia. Professor Martinez has secured grants totaling more than half a million dollars over the past four years, and is working on a second book, tentatively titled *Is History Whispering in Our Ear?*

Professor Martinez is co-director of CSUB’s Center for Social Justice – which co-produced Hollywood award-winning “American Migrant Stories” – is a member of the CSU state-wide Academic Senate and is CSU Bakersfield’s faculty union representative. He has done regular political commentary for various media outlets (local and international) and has hosted and produced several radio programs in Bakersfield.

Professor Martinez raised two children, an adopted niece and is married to Wendy Avila, who is a Superior Court judge in Kern County.
